

Greenland Exposed

The Tolbooth in Stirling is the venue for the first showing of the latest sound-art installation by Bridge of Allan resident and University of Stirling environmental scientist Paul Adderley and his colleague composer Michael Young from Goldsmiths College, University of London.

Their sound-art installation "Exposure" combines the skills of the two academics to examine southern Greenland as a place of settlement for the Vikings over a thousand years ago.

Dr Adderley says: "The installation uses visual information gained from forensically examining soils from old settlements; this information concerns the everyday life of the Viking settlers and is used in this installation to inform the synthesis of the sounds heard."

"Michael and I hope that the work will invite the audience to reflect on the nature of these past communities and

extremes of the environment they lived in."

This installation follows a busy year for the artists, with their previous work, "Ground-breaking", shown in the National Museum in Edinburgh, and at major events in both London and Prague.

Admittance to the event, which runs from 14th to 30th March, is free. The exhibition opens as part of National Science and Engineering Week.
