On Sunday evening last about half-past six o'clock a motor cyclist was passing through the village when ... the petroleum tank which is attached to the bicycle to some cause or other went on fire, and flames soon made their appearance. On seeing the flames the rider quickly dismounted, and with the aid of some passers-by the flames were speedily extinguished. Apparently little damage was done, as the rider was able to proceed on his journey. (October 5)

Mr Robert Allan, fruiterer, Henderson Street ... had on view in one of his shop windows a splendid display of large potatoes. The tubers, which all belonged to one "shaw", were eight in number, and weighed eight pounds.
